Juxtaposed around snow-capped mountains, living it up in the outdoors is definitely the predominant lifestyle for all tourists and locals alike with its easy access to its surrounding nature.

Taupo is also known as the trout fishing capital of the world. Now, when you're in the number one place for trout, there is no better introduction to the region than a hopping onto a boat ride and going fishing in the majestic lake. Pick up a fishing guide and head out to the crispy waters for your catch of the day. To preserve its delicate and unique ecosystem, Taupo has a few guidelines about fishing, so be sure to ask your guide about any rules before you swirl that fishing rod.

Even though Taupo is famous for its trout, you can't purchase this king of fishes. What you can do is to take your catch into any of the restaurants where they will cook it the way you want! Talk about enjoying fresh seafood!

#### Taupo's Legends and **Countless Wonders**

The wondrous region of Taupo has a proud history handed down and built around the Tangata Whenua - the People of the Land, as well as many interesting legends. Visit the Pure Ora **Garden** found at the **Taupo Museum** and Art Gallery to learn about Taupo's unique interpretations of historical happenings. When you're enlightened about the people's affection through their cultural beliefs passed down from one generation to the next, it's not hard to understand the deep love they harbour for their land.





A testament of the close relationship between the Tangata Whenua and the land can be seen in the Maori Rock Carvings at Mine Bay on Lake Taupo. Accessible only by boat, these magnificent carvings are more than 10 meters high and tower over the deep waters that are illuminated by the beautiful setting sun. Created by master carver, Matahi Whakataka-Brightwell, when he came to Taupo to visit his mother's land, this work of art has become an important cultural attraction for the region.



#### A Blend of Nature's Marvelous Landscapes

Taupo is also famous for its many geothermal sites such as the **Karapiti** (Craters of the Moon) where the last visages of the active volcanoes are still seething with steam vents, thermal mud pools and sulphurous fumes. The Craters of the Moon circulated its appearance around 1950 as a result of utilizing the underground thermal energy in the **Wairakei Valley**. Its forbidding and desolate moonscape and swirling clouds of steam shed much light upon the seldom seen story of earth's fiery infernos.

From thermal moonscapes to captivating dense forests, Taupo will capture your heart with its picturesque landscapes of valleys, gorges and peaks. Carving a series of winding rivers among proud mountains, another must-see in here is the majestic **Huka Falls**. This set of cascading water upstream of the **Waikato River** drops through an impressive height of 18 meters.

Get your hiking shoes on and trudge across 18 kilometers of mountainous and volcanic terrain on the **Tongariro Alpine Crossing**. Set against a dramatic backdrop starting from

Mangetpopo and crossing the length of Mount Tongariro to finish at Ketetahi, this is most definitely one of the best treks in the world.

With so much to offer, the allure of Taupo lies not in just its splendid natural landscapes but also in the marvelous warmth of its people. You will find that time often stands still in Taupo as you bask in amazing landscapes, relax by the tranquil lake or meditate about Mother Nature's splendor while you sip coffee. 

Start with the Goa State Museum and Latin Quarter in Panaji and then explore the famous churches of Old Goa and the Hindu temples in Ponda. Afterwards, head inland and visit Goa's highest waterfalls – the Dudhsagar Falls. Stop by the Bhagwan Mahavir Wildlife Sanctuary to see the interesting variety of animals found in Goa.

Visit the forts! Go to Bardez (near Candolim) to see the fort at Reis Magos, then hire a taxi or a scooter, and ride up to the Corjuem Fort in the Bicholim taluka (district). Or catch a ferry from Pomburpao to Chorao Island for an idyllic day. On your way back, visit Mayem Lake for a leisurely lunch. Finally, head out to Margao and check out the ancestral Portuguese colonial mansions at Loutolim and Chandor.

There is simply so much to see and do that this kaleidoscopic "Ibiza of Asia" may well offer you THE greatest vacation ever!

#### The Lesser-Known Tales of Shanghai

Since you're already in the city, let's head off first to the quaint water villages of Zhujiajiao, Suzhou, or Zhuangzhou. Built on a network of waterways, you can take a lovely misty morning gondola ride through any of these villages and see the Ming and Qing Dynasties architecture! In Suzhou you can visit a silk-spinning factory to see how Chinese silk has been produced for 600 years.

Unless you can't resist the shopping any longer, travel away from the shopping paths of Nanjing Road or North Sichuan Road and go instead to the Hongkou District. Visit the spiritual heart of Shanghai's Jewish community – the Ohel Moishe Synagogue. Built in 1927, it has been reconstructed to its original appearance and also features a photo exhibition from the war period.

Drop by the peaceful greenery of Huoshan Park where the Monument in Memory of Jewish Refugees now stands. A must-see stop for a bustling atmosphere of antique and curio

houses, calligraphers' and painters' studios and literary clubs, **Duolun Road** beams with its 1920s and 30s Art Deco buildings.



Then take a boat out towards Jiangsu Province to Tongli – an unforgettable water village founded in the Song Dynasty and built on seven islets with 15 canals and nearly 50 bridges. The Jiayin Hall (built in 1922) showcases more than 1,000 years of history and cultural heritage with a collection of over 100 well-preserved woodcarvings of classical Chinese figurines. Another interesting site to visit here is the China Ancient Sexual Cultural Museum. This very interesting and unique museum explores more than 6,000 years of human sexuality. It also features a large collection of historic and erotic artwork and artifacts relating to sexual culture in China.

#### Life in the City

Back in the city, the **Shanghai Museum** is one of the best







## HAINAN

#### Historical Hainan

Let's begin with a bit of history. Visit the Five Officials' Temple in Haikou that was built in the late 19th century to honor five officials who were exiled to the island by the emperors during the Tang and Song Dynasty. The Hai Rui Tomb, built in 1589, is the resting place of a righteous Ming Dynasty official of Hainan origins. You can also hop over to the Hainan Provincial Museum to learn about the ethnic minorities of Li and Miao and see more than two million artifacts, mainly from the Xisha artifacts recovered from underwater.

Located just outside of Haikou in Xiuying Village, the Xiuying Fort Barbette was built in 1890 to defend south-eastern China during the Sino-French War. The fort's five cannons are still intact and viewable at the site today. Also, you can visit the ancestral home of the famous Soong Sisters found in northeast of the Island in Wenchang.

#### Scenic Hainan


A must-see in Hainan Island is the **Shishan Volcanic Cluster National Geopark**. Covering an area of over 40 Quaternary volcanoes (the last eruption was 10,000 years ago) and 30 lava tunnels, this volcanic landscape has a multitude of thermal hot springs and lush primeval forests.

Standing at 1,867 meters tall, Wuzhi Mountain (found in Wuzhi Shan City) is regarded as the symbol of Hainan Island's beauty. Behold an impressive sight as the Wuzhi Mountain Waterfall cascades down its summit at over 1,000 meters. Then take an exciting boat ride through the Wuzhi Mountain Canyons where the mighty waterfall trails into deep ponds.

The beautiful **Wanquan River** weaves down from Wuzhi Mountain through misty, tropical rainforests to the charming **Qionghai City**. Here you can





A little outside of the town, you will find the popular and reconstructed **Phsar Leu Thom Thmei**.

#### Siem Reap's Natural Beauty

If you're feeling more adventurous, venture farther out of town to **Boeung Tonle Sap (Tonle Sap Lake)**. The **Prek Toal Bird Sanctuary** in the **Tonle Sap Biosphere Reserve** is considered the most important breeding ground in Southeast Asia for globally-threatened large water birds. This is also the perfect place to whip out your camera for some great nature photography.

Then make a visit to **Kampong Phluk**, a cluster of three villages of stilted houses standing as tall as six meters on the floodplain of Boeung Tonle Sap. The village is a flooded mangrove forest that hosts a variety of wildlife. Further north of Kampong Phluk is the less touristy and quieter village of **Kampong Khleang**.

Make your way to the south of Siem Reap to another bird sanctuary known

as the **Ang Trapeng Thmor Sarus Crane Reserve**. This unique wetland is a feeding ground for more than 300 Sarus Cranes and over 200 other species of birds, including endangered species.

#### The 1,000 Year-Old Kingdom

No one comes to Siem Reap and not visit Angkor Thom. Built around the 11th century, some of the highlights within this archaeological jewel are the Angkor Wat (of course!) – the largest religious structure in the world, the breathtakingly ambient Preah Palilay and Ta Prohm, the Four Gates, the Terrace of the Leper King and the Terrace of the Elephant, the Bayon Temple and the Baphuon.

Outside a mere 400 meters of Angkor Thom is **Phnom Bakheng**. One of the first temple-mountains built in the vicinity of Angkor, Phnom Bakheng lets you witness a beautiful sunset view of Angkor Wat. Also outside the Angkor Thom area, **Bantay Srei** is a temple dedicated to the Hindu God Shiva.

Siem Reap may merely be your gateway to experience nothing less than a life-inspiring exploration to one of the world's most enduring beacons of historical architecture.
