Chinese Travellers Changing Trends

According to the Wall Street Journal, although mainland China travellers tend to prefer Hong Kong and Macau for their duty-free shopping, increasing numbers of tourists are exploring beyond Greater China for their rest and relaxation. A recent survey by travel website Trip Advisor found that nearly half of the top 20 international destinations for Chinese travellers were in Southeast Asia, while locations such as Kyoto, Japan, and Jeju Island in South Korea are undergoing explosive growth in interest from mainland Chinese tourists. According to Chinese travel agency Ctrip, Chinese interest in Southeast Asia is driven by the country's young white-collar workers, who don't have the time or money to go as far as Europe. Trip Adviser's 20 most popular outbound destinations for mainland Chinese travellers were based on July and August 2013 figures on Daodao.com, a customised version of Trip Advisor designed specifically for Chinese travellers. Hong Kong was at the top of the list of popular destinations among Chinese tourists, followed by Phuket in Thailand and Taiwan.



Too Sick to Fly?

WHAT YOU CAN DO WHEN YOU BECOME ILL WHILE YOU'RE AWAY ON VACATION.

e all know not to fly when we're sick - an airplane is a petri dish for germs. But what if you're already at your destination when you catch something? We interviewed Devyani Lal, M.D., a rhinologist at the Mayo Clinic's Arizona campus, for advice including how to alleviate your symptoms and avoid infecting other travelers.

Postpone your flight

"If you are really sick, you should just stay at your destination," Dr Lal says. Most airlines let you rebook, but you'll be charged a cancellation fee (anywhere from \$120 to \$180, depending on the type of ticket you purchased) and any difference in airfare. Travel Insurance may cover the cost of rescheduling your flight, though you will probably need a doctor's certificate. Smartraveller.com.au states travel insurance is as essential as your passport, regardless of vour travel destination. If you can't afford travel insurance, you can't afford to travel! If you incur medical expenses while overseas and you don't have travel insurance, you are personally liable for covering these costs. The Government cannot pay for medical expenses overseas. Nor will your domestic private health insurance. Some travel insurance offer a trip-interruption benefit that includes illness. So if you're too sick to board the plane and you get a doctors certificate you may be covered.

If you must travel, wear a mask It will undoubtedly call attention to you,

It will undoubtedly call attention to you, and that's probably a good thing. If you're sick "you're creating a virus factory," Dr Lal says, and you don't want to subject others to your germs. (As Lal points out, 90 percent of colds are caused by viruses, which are highly contagious. Bacterial infections are less common and don't spread as easily.) Some pharmacies and airport vendors sell masks.

Congestion relief

The Neti pot is an Indian device used to clean out the sinuses: You pour warm, salty water from the pot into one nostril and let it drain out the other. "The Neti pot has very low side effects and is well tolerated by most patients, Dr. Lal says. "I'd say that 99 percent of my patients like it." As another option, try squirting salty water (either previously boiled or distilled) into your nostrils with a plastic squeeze bottle. Both Neti pots and nasal squeeze bottles are sold at pharmacies. (Be sure to clean the Neti pot or squeeze bottle as directed between uses.*)

Help for a sinus infection

Start treatment with a nasal decongestant (such as Vicks Sinex), since there are fewer side effects, Dr. Lal says. If that doesn't help, try an oral decongestant such as Sudafed.



(Don't take Sudafed if you have severe high blood pressure, or severe coronary artery disease.) To keep your ears from hurting during the flight, use a nasal spray 25 minutes before takeoff and 25 minutes before landing. "The lining of the nose is connected to the eustachian tube, which equalizes pressure from the ear to prevent pain," Dr. Lal explains.

Antibiotics - the last resort

As viruses cause most sinus infections and colds, antibiotics are useless against them (and a cold will go away in a week anyway). But should your cold not go away after a week, or has gotten worse, you may have a bacterial infection. See a doctor, who may prescribe antibiotics. If you're prone to infection and are traveling to a country where finding antibiotics may be difficult, consider asking your doctor to give you a short course of antibiotics to carry with you just in case.

Château de Crémat

The intertwined C's carved into the stonework and etched into the windows here should look familiar. That's right, they make up the Chanel logo, except Crémat had the logo first. In the 1920s, Coco Chanel was pals with the then owner, and he gave her the copyright as a gift. (The château's logo is now CK, for current owner Cornelis Kamerbeek.) Crémat stands in the hills above Nice in the Bellet appellation, the smallest in France. Don't miss the Terrasse du Ciel (Terrace of Heaven) for its panoramic view of Nice and the sea. The easiest way to get there is on the No. 62 bus from Nice. Catch it at the Magnan bus station, and after a scenic 25-minute ride, it will stop right outside the château's gates. 442 Chemin de Crémat, Nice

Clos Sainte Magdeleine

This is the Miss World of vineyards, set on a thumb-shaped peninsula high above the Mediterranean. The wines are from the Cassis appellation (pronounced cass-see to distinguish it from the black currant liqueur) and the estate is best known for its white wine, exotic with notes of almond and honey. The tour takes in the domaine, where groves of olive, mulberry and almond trees grow, and the cellar, concluding with a tasting (\$22 per person). Cassis, a particularly comely town, is 15 miles southeast of Marseilles. For one of the most scenic drives on this coast, follow the winding Route du Crête from Cassis to La Ciotat. clossaintemagdeleine.fr

Château de Beaucastel

This top winery shows off the rugged vineyard landscape of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. The terrain's chief peculiarity is its galets, softball-sized stones that look like the remnants of a meteor shower. In fact, they were torn from the Alps during the last Ice Age and deposited here. Some experts say the stones help ripen the grapes by absorbing heat during the day and releasing it at night. Beaucastel, one of Châteauneuf-du-Pape's best, is the only property that still uses all 13 grape varietals permitted by law in the appellation. You will be delighted by the impressive barrel room and the charming tour guide. By appointment only; beaucastel.com

Domaine de Coyeux

Beaumes-de-Venise, 20 miles northeast of Avignon, is the sweet spot of the Rhone Valley, known particularly for its dessert wine made from muscat, once called the Nectar of the Pope. The tasting room at this top producer, which also makes red wine, has an impossibly beautiful setting. The vineyards undulate away toward robust rock outcroppings called the Dentelles de Montmirail for their teethlike shape. The tasting room is in a modern rendition of a traditional Provençal mas, or farmhouse. Route de Lafare, Beaumes-de-Venise

Château la Canorgue

This property is in Bonnieux, the classic Provençal hill town that formed the heart of the world described by Peter Mayle in his best seller, "A Good Year". In fact, the 17thcentury château is such an exempla - honeycolored stone, cornflower-blue shutters - that it was the setting for the 2006 film of the same name, starring Russell Crowe and Albert Finney. (Trivia: A swimming pool installed for the movie was later covered over and the ground replanted with vines.) The château is known for its handsome blue bottles - more like packaging for Swedish water than for French wine. Route du Pont Julien, Bonnieux

Tobago's Turn

Tobago feels like the Caribbean the way it used to be. How much longer can we keep it a secret?

Tobago, power down your smartphone and put away your shoes. No, really, thongs or flops will do fine. Fancy clothes? Not needed here; you're on one of the Caribbean's least glitzy islands.

The littler of the two sisters that make up the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago sits just off the coast of Venezuela and is less than 120 square miles. You can drive around the island in a day, even if you stop to marvel

at the views in its hilly northern half, where each palm-fringed bay seems lovelier than the last.

Getting Around

Renting a car gives you the most freedom, but be aware that roads can be steep and winding. Taxis are available, or you can book a tour. A boat tour is another good option especially in a glass-bottomed boat.

Beach Time

Pigeon Point is the headquarters of Tobago Waterholics, one of many companies offering deep-sea fishing, dive trips to the famous Buccoo Reef and boat tours. Along the way you'll see countless pelicans and maybe spot dolphins and giant leatherback sea turtles. Pigeon Point Road; 868-688-7669; tobagowaterholics.com; coastal tour, \$110 per person

Into the Wild

When you book an Off-Road Safari with Tobago Now, your guide will probably be the irrepressible Fabrizio Ceppi, of Swiss-Italian heritage. He drives through isolated villages, like Culloden and Mason Hall, and if swimming under a waterfall has always been a fantasy, ask Fab to take you to the Highland Waterfall. 868-639-1476; tobagonow.com; six-hour Off-Road Safari, \$97 per person, includes a light lunch.

To Market. to Market

Scarborough, the capital, won't require a long visit. But the market is worth seeing, especially on a busy Friday or Saturday. While you're in the vicinity, keep an eye out for locals lining up beside a food truck. They're probably waiting for doubles, and you should too. These are East Indian sandwiches consisting of hot, fluffy fried

bread wrapped around a filling of channa (curried chick peas) and doused with chutney and hot sauce. It's the fast-food snack that's satisfying at any hour (and costs less than \$1.20 a piece).

Just outside Scarborough is Fort King George, built in the 1770s by the British. Its museum offers an overview of island history and well worth a visit. Admission is about \$1.00.

Time to Spare

German ex-pat Veronika La Fortune and her Trinidadian husband, Lennon, run a horse-rescue operation called Being With Horses.

Seoul is one of the most popular tourist destinations and it is packed with traditional markets, high end labels, cutting edge shopping and some great bargains. So wear comfortable shoes, put on a smile, bring your money and let's go shopping.



Myeongdong If you love fashion and style you are in for a treat. Megeongdong is the centre of shopping in Seoul consisting of over 300,000 square meters of pure shopping. Here you will find big brand names such as Zara, the fashion giant UNIQLO, H&M and Nike. Migliore Mall is a major draw card for visitors and shoppers. There is easy access to it's stores through various ubway connections and it is regarded as he shopping district for the 5 to 20+ age roup. Teenagers tend to flock here, as

Hall on level seven. There are so many shops here, and many sell unique selfdesigned clothes, bags and shoes. Plus it has the famous Lotte Department store with several floors of duty free shopping where you buy hands free and pick up at the airport later. shopping inside and outside the buildings. Many shops specialise in Korean made fashion and you will no doubt find yourself in shopper's paradise with over 26 malls to wander through. One of the best things about Dongdaemun is the night markets. The vendors setup around 9pm and you can shop until the sun rises. This really is shopping utopia! This is also a fantastic place to try out some local cuisine.

Apgujeong One of the wealthiest areas in Seoul, Apgujeong is where all the high end fashionistas hangout. Name brands such as Louis Vuitton, Prada and Channel have setup their main shops here. There's also the Galleria Department Store, housing top line fashion labels. If you love high end shopping and people watching you'll be in seventh heaven. Despite the high end shops there are also plenty of affordable, yet trendy shops to check out as well, so don't be too scared off by all the luxury.

Itaewon Famous for its custom tailored suits, Itaewon is well worth paying a visit. This area is renowned for providing excellent quality at great prices. The price of a tailored, custom designed suit starts as little as \$200 and most tailors speak English. China's Seaside FSCAPE

From white-sand beaches to world-class golf courses, the island of Hainan is JUST THE PLACE for a tropical getaway

VACATION METROPOLIS: (Clockwise from left) Hainan is no sleepy beach town, it is a buzzing city with all of the trappings you would expect... shopping, restaurants and a lush tropical hinterland teeming with wildlife. Offering all styles of accomodation from family friendly to high end luxury. All roads lead to the beach day and night. In between eating, sunbathing and shopping you can take in one of the many cultural attaractions.

Its 24 Balinese-inspired treatment rooms and suites surround a traditional courtyard; some have private Jacuzzis and tubs made of Italian stone. Treatments range from facials to the "Shen Harmonizer" - a soothing deep-tissue massage using warm volcanic stones that are meant to get your qi (life energy) flowing. Afterward, linger in the jade steam room or sign up for a gentle session of tai chi.

The spas run by the Banyan Tree hotel chain are known for their state-of-the-art facilities, experienced therapists and Asian-inspired therapies. At the 61-villa **Banyan Tree Sanya** (6 Luling Rd., Sanya; 86-898-8860-9988; banyantree.com), on the Luhuitou Peninsula, the spa has 16 suites and an area devoted to Thai massage. The highlight is the cutting-edge hydrothermal complex, where therapists guide guests through a series of cabins equipped with rain showers, jet pools, a hammam and even ice. (Alternating between hot and cold is believed to boost blood circulation.) The two and a half hour Oriental Ritual combines Tibetan massage techniques with a body scrub that is followed by a soak in a lavender-scented bath.

At newcomer **Anantara Sanya's** spa (6 Xiaodonghai Rd., Sanya; 86-898-8888-5088; anantara.com), the eight treatment rooms have traditional Chinese touches (daybeds, birdcages, live koi). There's also a plunge pool, steam room, spa-jet pool and Swiss-shower room. Sign up for one of the tea-based treatments, such as the Green Tea Purification, a three-hour session that includes a bath, scrub, body wrap and massage - all using products that contain green tea leaves, which are thought to help detoxify, boost the immune system and ease aches and pains.





Surfing, palm trees and powdery beaches aren't usually the first things that come to mind when you think of China. But that's exactly what you'll find on the island of Hainan, the country's southernmost and smallest province. Located in the South China Sea, the island was in ancient times a lonely backwater inhabited by banished dissidents and other undesirables. As China's fortunes have soared in the past two decades, the newly wealthy have discovered Hainan, drawn by its sunny shores, clear waters and balmy climate.

Hainan is now home to China's most luxurious beach resorts as well as pampering spas and internationally acclaimed golf courses. So far, development has focused on the provincial capital, Haikou, on the north shore, and Sanya, the resort enclave in the south. As a vacation destination, Hainan may not be to everyone's taste: The crowds of Hawaiian-shirted local tourists are difficult to elude, especially during the winter high season, and beyond the resort areas there's little to do. But if you're traveling to Hong Kong and looking to squeeze in a relaxing beach escape, the 90-minute flight to Sanya may be just the ticket. Here are some of the best of what Hainan has to offer.

On Spa Time

Sprawling over 215,000 square feet and encompassing 61 treatment rooms, a library, a café and a garden, the spa at the Mission Hills Resort Haikou (1 Mission Hills Blvd., Haikou; 86-898-6868-3888; missionhillschina.com) is one of the world's largest. Its circular design resembles that of the houses built by the area's Hakka people, and Chinese traditions are incorporated in the treatments. The Pearl of the Orient facial uses locally harvested ground pearls, believed to help soothe and hydrate the skin. Some 200 hot and cold springs for bathing are on the grounds.

On Sanya's scenic Yalong Bay, the Ritz-Carlton, Sanya offers the 30,000-squarefoot **ESPA**, the hotel chain's largest spa in Asia (Yalong Bay National Resort District; 86-898-8898-8888; ritzcarlton.com).



UNEXPECTED CHINA: You could be excused for thinking you were in Mexico or the Bahamas but this is China.

Best Beaches

Palm-fringed beaches are Hainan's main lure and the reason for the island's (somewhat hyperbolic) nickname, China's Hawaii. **Yalong Bay Beach** (admission \$10) is Sanya's star attraction: a nearly five-mile-long stretch of white sands framed by jungle-clad mountains and crystalline waters. Some of the area's toniest resorts are located here, which means fewer beach vendors.

A 90-minute drive northeast of Sanya, **Riyuewan Beach** is the island's premier surfing spot. Amateurs and veterans travel here for the famous left-hand point break. It's considered an excellent spot for firsttimers to learn to ride the waves. Once sleepy, the area is now chockablock with surf shops and backpacker accommodations, but it's still less hectic than Hainan's betterknown bathing spots.

On the east coast near the town of Bo'ao is **Yudai Beach** (admission \$11.30), a narrow strip between the Wanquan River and the South China Sea (the name means "jade belt"). While its sand is not as fine as that of Yalong, it's nowhere near as crowded.

Tee Time

Hainan already has more than 29 golf courses, and is fast becoming Asia's golfing capital. Leading the way is the **Mission Hills Resort Haikou**, whose 10 courses lie on top of a chain of dormant volcanoes. Designed by the innovative Schmidt-Curley firm, the courses range from the player-friendly Preserve, which stretches to 6,535 yards, to the rugged, 350-acre Blackstone, built with international tournaments in mind.

If 10 courses sounds overwhelming, consider the 18-hole Robert Trent Jones Jr.-designed course at the **Yalong Bay Golf Club** (yalongbaygolfclub.com), shaped like a dragon's claw and covering 168 acres overlooking the sea. Near Haikou, the **West Coast Golf Club** (www.westgolf.com.cn/ en) has an 18-hole course for all skill levels, also with sea views. Need to work on your swing? There's a double-level driving range with 60 bays here.



FOOD WITH A VIEW: There are a multitude of eating options in Hainan and a great many of them are on the beachfront, affording great views of the beach and ocean beyond.

Day-tripping

Long before large numbers of Han Chinese began migrating to Hainan during the Song Dynasty (960–1276), the island was populated by the Li, an ethnic minority from southern China known for their women's intricate facial tattoos. Li, as well as members of the Miao tribe, still live on the island, and it's worth arranging a trip to their villages to see another side of Hainan (The touristy Li and Miao Village at Bing Lang Gu is not recommended). Ask your resort's concierge to set up a private tour. And during your visit, always request permission before taking photos. Inland, Hainan is still covered with

subtropical rainforests where black crested gibbons, clouded leopards and numerous bird species dwell. A two-hour drive from Sanya, the 172-square-mile Jianfengling National Forest Park (admission \$16.30), in the island's southwest, provides your best chance to spot these rare animals. Make sure to go with a guide; this can be arranged by a tour agency or through your hotel. A good day trip from Haikou is the Shishan Volcanic Cluster National Geopark (about nine miles away; admission \$12.55) a collection of dramatic craters and caves formed by long-ago eruptions. But however you choose to spend your time on Hainan, you're sure to leave refreshed.

Devon's always been known for its fabulous food. Its farms and coast produce some of the best fresh produce in the country, and it boasts wonderful tearooms, great foodie pubs, and one of the top-rated fine-dining restaurants in the UK Michael Caines' Gidleigh Park.

And Devon now has another big foodie draw: Plymouth. This up-and-coming coastal city has become a celebrity chef restaurant hotspot, with diners able to choose from Hugh Fearnly-Whittingstall, James and Chris Tanner, Gary Rhodes, Mitch Tonks and Anton Piotrowski. So if food is your thing then be prepared for some gastronomic courses that are sure to ignite your palate.



PLYMOUTH is one of the most lively and captivating locations to visit in Devon. With its rich maritime heritage and its status as the regional capital for culture. If you're a nautical enthusiast, then be sure to make a trip to Plymouth Hoe. This is one of the most beautiful natural harbours in the world. If you are willing to climb 93 steps up Smeaton's Tower you can get fantastic views of Plymouth. Or if that sounds too hard you can hop on the Wheel of Plymouth. Also set against the backdrop of Plymouth's picturesque harbour is Barbican, a bustling collection of specialist shops, cafes, restaurants, and world-class attractions in Devon. In addition, there's Sutton Harbour, where you can visit the world-famous Plymouth Gin Distillery or drop in on the National Marine Aquarium.

CLOVELLY clings to a steep 400ft cliff where donkeys were once used to transport people and goods up the steep cobbled streets. The Quay (stone platform for unloading and loading ships) here dates back to the 14th Century and has a great deal of smuggling and pirate history associated with it. This picture-postcard, once bustling fishing village has kept its original charms. Colourful, flower bedecked cottages line the steep cobbled streets (where traffic is banned) and lead down to the ancient harbour below. High Street in Clovelly is steep and can be slippery - so do

wear sensible footwear. If you walk down you can take the fare-paying Land Rover service back to the top. Your entrance fee to the village covers an audio-visual programme introducing you to Clovelly's fascinating history, two museums - the Kingsley Museum and the Fisherman's Cottage, Clovelly Court Gardens and Parking. It's good to know that a substantial part of your fee contributes to Clovelly's ongoing restoration and maintenance program. Adult: \$13 Child: \$8.30 (ages 7 to16) Family: \$34.50 (2 adults, 2 children).

DARTMOUTH is home to Dartmouth Castle, one of the most beautifully located fortresses in England. For over 600 years Dartmouth Castle has guarded the narrow entrance to the Dart Estuary and the busy, vibrant port of Dartmouth. Climb to the top for dramatic views across the estuary and see how it could be blocked in wartime by a heavy chain. There's also plenty to do inside the castle and if the weather is fine, you can make it a full day out with a riverboat trip from the town quay up to the castle, landing you a minute's walk away from the castle entrance. After you have explored the castle, there is a riverside tearoom with light lunches and snacks. Entry: Adult \$10.20, Child (5-15 years) \$6.15, Concession \$9.20 and Family \$26.40.

The sights Colourful fishing boats on long stretches of pebbled beaches are a sight throughout Devon: Polperro fishing village in England's South West; Dartmouth Castle guards the entrance to the Dart Estuary.

HISTORIC HOUSES



Hartland Abbey is a fascinating house. Built across a narrow. wooded valley leading to an Atlantic cove, Henry VIII gifted the Abbey to The Keeper of his Wine Cellar, whose descendants live here today. Experience not only the stunning interiors, collections, beautiful gardens and walks but also the warmth and friendliness only found in a family home cherished for generations.



Arlington Court is an unexpected jewel: a complete family estate. The intimate Regency house contains treasures for all tastes, from model ships to shells, all collected by the Chichesters. English Cream Tea

he cream tea is considered the regional dish of Devon. Today Devonshire Tea has been adopted with varied recipes around the world in many tourist regions. However, the traditional scone is made from just a few ingredients and things that you would normally find on a farm. That's how scones with clotted cream and jam originally come from farms. So the best place to savour your scones is Devon, but if you can't get there yet, try out our simple recipes.

SCONES

Makes 12 Best served warm from the oven (if hot the cream slides off) and should be eaten on the day.

Oven temperature: 220 °C preheat Cooking time: 10-15 minutes Cooking utensil: greased oven tray

Ingredients

2 cups self raising flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon of butter ¾ cup milk

Method

- 1 Collect ingredients
- 2 Rub butter into flour and salt. using the fingertips
- 3 Mix into a soft dough with milk. Add additional milk if required
- 4 Turn on to a lightly floured board and knead until smooth and elastic
- 5 Roll out 2cm thick and cut into shapes using a cutter or knife
- 6 Arrange on oven tray and glaze tops with milk using a pastry brush
- 7 Place in oven above the centre and bake until golden brown. To test, the sides of the scone should be set
- 8 Lift onto a cake cooler
- 9 While still warm break in half and serve with clotted cream and strawberry jam and a pot of tea.

QUICK STRAWBERRY JAM

Makes ¾ to 1 cup Refrigerate for up to 10 days or freeze for longer storage.

Ingredients

2 cups strawberries, hulled 1/4 cup sugar 1 Tbsp. lemon juice

Method

- 1 Place the strawberries in a food processor or blender and process until smooth or chunky, whichever way you like
- 2 Put strawberries, sugar and lemon juice into a non-stick skillet and bring to a boil over medium-high heat
- 3 Let boil rapidly until reduced and thickened, approximately 10 minutes Pour into a jar and allow to cool to room temperature before covering and storing in the fridge

A pot of tea

A good tea is recommended to help wash down all the sugar and complements the dish brilliantly.

While milk is optional, the teapot is essential for a good cup of tea and it really does taste better from a China cup.

CLOTTED CREAM

Makes 2 ½ cups (Refrigerate for up to 5 days)

Ingredients

2 cups (500ml) pure cream

Method

Stir cream until smooth and pour into a shallow ovenproof dish. Place dish in a water bath on the lowest shelf of the oven and bake at 100 degrees for about 6 hours. Refrigerate the cream until chilled and set. Use as required.

S ituated on the western coast of India in the coastal belt known as Konkan, Goa has a soul that reaches deep into its thought-provoking history, rich culture and some of the most beautiful natural scenery that India has to offer.

Legends from Hindu mythology credit Lord Parshuram, an incarnation of Lord Vishnu with the creation of Goa. Over the centuries various dynasties including Rashtrakutas, Kadambas, Silaharas, Chalukyas, Bahamani Muslims and most notably the Portuguese have ruled Goa. On December 19, 1961 the Indian Army from Portuguese colonisation liberated Goa and it became a Union Territory along with the enclaves of Daman and Diu. On May 30, 1987 Goa was conferred statehood and became the 25th state of the Indian Republic.

Goa has a multi-hued and distinctive lifestyle quite different from the rest of India. Hindu and Catholic communities make up almost the entire population with minority representation of Muslims and other religions. Because of its diversity there are some great activities to do and places to go when vacationing in this unique part of the world. Let's take a glimpse.

BODY ART

Get a black henna tattoo painted onto any part of your body by a tribal tattoo artist right on the beach. You can choose from a large variety of designs, ranging from simple to really intricate. And the best thing about a henna tattoo is that it fades away after a few weeks so you can't be bound for too long to your choice of design!

PARTY

There is live entertainment and dancing music in Goa's popular nightspots so let your hair down, rid those inhibitions and join in with some traditional Goan dancing. Goa has many popular cultural events throughout the year so check out their calendar to see what is happening during your planned vacation. *www.goatourism.gov.in*

SNACK SHACKS

When it comes to food Goa certainly knows how to please our taste buds. There are numerous shacks that provide an amazing range of food and aside from the stellar menus and wonderful cooks, they are a great place to hang out with your friends and family. Infantaria at Calangute has a large collection of superbly prepared snacks and bakes. Their breakfast options are superb. Curly's on Anjuna is a shack that serves some seriously good food. You'll always find a group of hippies sitting around here and young people playing ball on the beach in front. Britto's at Baga is a very popular beachside multi cuisine restaurant with tables leading onto the beach where you can dig your toes in the sand while digging into a grilled lobster. At night, all their tables are candle lit and the sea breeze is just perfect.



OLD GOA

Visiting Old Goa is quite the experience and one feels totally transported back in time wandering around its corridors and by-lanes.

Goa has some of the best and oldest churches - so make a point of visiting a shrine or two during your vacation and appreciate the culture and architecture. The Basilica of Bom Jesus, located in Old Goa is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Containing the tomb and mortal remains of St Francis Xavier, this 3-tiered structure of Doric, Corinthian and Composite styles is a must visit for firsttimers! Mary Immaculate Conception Church in Panjim is also an intriguing piece of architecture. When visiting South Goa a must visit is a trip to the Church of St. Alex this is the oldest church in GOA and the first chapel church situated on the banks of the Angoddi Tollem Lake.

BEACHES

Goa has endless beaches including Palolem Beach, one of the worlds top beaches

located in South Goa. North Beaches steal the limelight but the South beaches can be calmer and beautiful. Asvern Beach and Calangute Beach are both in North Goa. Dotted with shacks and lounges be prepared to kick back with a Mojito or Pina Colada. Among the exotic beaches of South Goa Arassim Beach and Utordo Beach are also very popular. If you are after peace and quiet, Aganda Beach is well worth a visit. It is unspoiled and untouched by fisherman and tourists with a serene beach setting located near the town of Maordo.

If you plan your trip to Ashwem anywhere in between September to February don't forget to check out the Olive Ridley turtles. Ashwem is the nesting place for this rare species of turtles.

WATER SPORTS

Goan beaches are filled with water sport opportunities including water skiing, jet skiing, scuba diving, banana boat or take a sunset/moonlight boat cruise along the Mandovi River. You might be lucky enough to do some dolphin spotting while you are enjoying your cruise.

TOUR THE SPICE PLANTATION

Visit the Spice Plantation in Ponda area called Sahakari Spice Plantation. This hidden gem is the largest spice plantation in the region. There are regular tours so you can learn about the different spices including Peri Peri (hottest chilies in the world). You will be welcomed in a traditional way by offering Aarti, Kumkum, and a garland of flowers. Then you will be served with herbal team. Enjoy a healthy and nutritious Goan lunch, served in the traditional manner on a banana leaf.

SPLASH WITH THE ELEPHANTS

A fun thing to do when visiting Goa is to bath an elephant. The Tropical Spice Plantation will not only give you a traditional cultural and history tour but you will be treated to an amazing experience with their gentle giants (elephants).

You can enjoy a brief ride on an elephant but the best fun is the elephant bath. The elephants are in the water and you get to wade in and climb on their backs and soon you will be enjoying a bath with the elephants. Be prepared to have lots of laughter and get drenched. You can spend as much time as you want with the elephants and feed them as well. It will no doubt be a memorable experience and a highlight of your vacation.

SHOPPING SPREE

Ingo's Saturday Night Bazaar in Apara is a must. Here you will find hundreds of vendor stalls selling beads and jewelry, clothing, stoner paraphernalia and music. Even if you are not a big shopper, this is a fun place to go, as there is plenty of nightlife entertainment including jugglers, live musicians and plenty of food. The street shops are also popular, situated in the cities of Baga and Calangute. You can expect to find souvenirs, sarongs, swimwear, jholas (colourful trendy bags), and beads. Plus most beaches have vendors

touting their wares, but stay firm with what you want and your price as they are known to be a bit pushy.

RELAX

While in Goa take time out and enjoy some pampering. There are many Ayurvedic/ Ayurveda centres in Goa, which allow the ancient healing and medicines to distress and reenergize. Ayu means life and Veda means knowledge, and so Ayurveda is often referred to as the "Science of Life". Treat your senses to a transcendent atmosphere with a perfect balance of physical and spiritual wellness. The Balinese Massage at Snip Salon and Spa is located on the main road between Calangute and Candolim. Try their aromatic massage where you will drift away as you blissfully retreat from the cares of the world. www.snip.co.in

HOW TO GET THERE

Dabolim Airport, the sole airport of Goa is the nearest airport to the state. This civilian cum military airport connects the place



to both national as well as international destinations. Flights to Goa are frequent and well connected to all the corners of India. The airport is owned by the Indian Navy and is 30 kms away from Panaji.

GETTING AROUND

Travelling around Goa is fairly easy. There is an extensive road network, which connects most places in Goa.

By Bus: There are private as well as state transport corporation run bus services which service all the major locations. Despite the overcrowding, noise and offschedule service, there is a special charm in travelling in the private buses which are brightly painted and filled with colourful local characters.

By Car: A number of companies offer rental cars, both self and chauffeur-driven. Besides rented cars, there are the ubiquitous tourist taxis, which are available near most hotels and resorts and at all the tourist

attractions. There are two types of taxis the white-colored tourist taxis, and the yellow-topped black regular taxis. Almost all major towns and tourist attractions have a taxi stand, where both types of taxis are available. Most hotels also arrange a taxi for you on

request. Ensure that you fix a price for the entire journey before you sit in, so that you don't get overcharged at the end of the trip

By Motorcycle: Goa has a unique and very popular mode of transport known as a 'pilot'. This is in reality a motorcycle taxi. The motorcycle taxis are easily recognised by the yellow mudguards and yellow number plates. The driver who is known as the 'pilot' carries only one pillion rider at a time. Bargain with the pilot for a good rate for the trip before you set out. Another great way to see Goa is to hire a Vespa (scooter/motorized bike). It's the best way to explore the numerous roads and tracks, which will take you out into the villages and farming area. Scooters or motorbikes for rent are available in the main street on all popular Goa beaches. Scooters or motorbikes that are legally registered for hire have Black/Yellow, tourist vehicle and number plates.

By Auto-rickshaw: The three-wheeled auto-rickshaw taxi, painted yellow and black, is a common site in all Goan towns. This taxi is basically the front half of a motor scooter with a couple of seats mounted on the back. They usually take two to three passengers and are quite speedy on the crowded roads of Goan towns. Above all, they are very cheap as compared to taxis for travelling around the town.



Royal Goan Beach Club-Haathi Mahal 4129 This resort blends an Indian and Goan atmosphere with modern Western amenities.
