



Feet First

FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO HELP KEEP YOUR MOST IMPORTANT TRAVEL TOOL-YOUR OWN TWO FEET-IN GOOD SHAPE ON YOUR NEXT TRIP.

acations can be tough on your feet. Besides all that sightseeing, often on uneven ground, you tend to engage in activities you don't typically do at home, like hiking, running on trails and playing tennis. We interviewed podiatrist Martin G. Ellman at the Mayo Clinic, in Rochester, Minnesota, for his tips on how to help prevent and treat minor foot ailments such as blisters, corns, calluses and warts—and keep your feet in tip top shape.

Wear the right shoes. This may seem obvious, but many injuries occur when people wear inappropriate footwear such as sandals on a hike. Hiking shoes offer great ankle support, court shoes have more side-to-side support while running shoes have excellent shock absorption. "Try to use shoes for the activity you're doing," Ellman says.

Break in new shoes. Don't wear a new pair of hiking boots for the first time on the day of a hike. "You always want to break in a pair of shoes weeks before you go on a trip," Ellman says. This way if you do get blisters or corns, you can treat them at home and they won't mar your holiday.

Socks matter. If your feet tend to sweat during physical activity, invest in moisture absorbing socks. "Cotton socks are okay, but they stay damp. A damp environment on skin causes friction, which can lead to blisters." says Ellman. You can find moisture absorbing socks made of merino wool, synthetics or PLA (a corn-based fiber that's more eco-friendly than polyester) at most sporting goods stores.

Be prepared. Be sure to pack band aids and antibiotic ointment

in your toiletry bag. If you get a blister that's smaller than 5mm, apply ointment and a band aid and leave it alone. But if it's bigger than 5mm, Ellman advises draining it with a sterilised needle leaving the "roof" of the blister there to offer some protection. Then apply antibiotic ointment and a band aid to the area.

See a podiatrist. Corns and calluses are thick, hardened layers of skin caused by friction or pressure. The only difference is their location. Corns appear on or between your toes and calluses occur on your heel or the ball of your foot. Ellman says you can generally keep both in check by using a pumice stone or a skin file and applying lotion to your feet at night. (Do not do this if you're diabetic or have nerve problems in your feet—unless you've been instructed to do so by a medical professional.) If you have a corn or callus that's causing you pain, however, Ellman suggests seeing a podiatrist. If it's the result of a foot abnormality, such as a bunion or hammer toe, the solution is often as easy as getting your shoes stretched at a shoe repair store.

Warts and all. "Warts are viruses, and they're very unpredictable as to how they respond to treatment," Ellman says. For this reason you'll want to start treatment at least a month, before your trip. Usually over the counter or prescription medication will do the trick, but sometimes your doctor will recommend freezing the wart off with liquid nitrogen or using a laser. Also, whether or not you have a wart, Ellman suggests wearing shoes or sandals by the pool or in the locker room —it just may keep you from getting one.





Exotic THE MIDDLE KINGDOM

China occupies a huge swathe of real estate in the center of the Earth's largest land mass, hence why it's also known as the Middle Kingdom. The country's largeness also accounts for its diversity: on the same day in January, it could be a balmy 29 degrees Celsius on its southern end in Hainan, but snowing in



While Beijing and Shanghai might be the most well-known and visited cities in China, the country does have a host of other places well worth visiting. These days, an expanding network of high-speed trains (traveling at speeds up to 300 kilometers per hour), and a spider web of domestic flights allow travelers access to almost every town in China. Buses step in where planes and trains fear to tread. There's really no reason to not get out and explore some of China's exotic locales.



YANTAI

The coastal town of Yantai is located in the Shandong province along its eastern seaboard. Yantai literally translates as 'Smoke Platform', as fires were lit on the headlands during the Ming dynasty to signal the presence of any Japanese invaders. Later, the Qing dynasty (the last imperial dynasty) surrendered Yantai to the British who then used it for years as a treaty port for foreign trade. Today, breezy Yantai has a booming export industry as well as a cluster of concession architecture.

Visit the Yantai Hill Park and wander past concession-era buildings erected by a host of foreign powers. The former American, British and Japanese consulates, the lighthouse, and the Yantai Union Church are all stellar examples built alongside stone paths leading to the hilltop.

Another must-visit in the province is the Penglai Pavilion, 75km northwest of Yantai. The pavilion – poised on a bluff overlooking the sea – dates back to the Song dynasty. Here, the Taoist legend of the 'Eight Immortals crossing the sea' is celebrated via inscriptions and carvings. On occasion, locals claim to have seen a shimmering mirage on the horizon. Don't forget to check out the ancient military installation and temples en route to the pavilion.

Yantai Laishan Airport (http://www. ytairport.net/index.php) is located 15km south of the city. An airport shuttle takes you into town. A newer airport, the Yantai Penglai International Airport is scheduled to open in 2014/2015 and will be 43km away from the city. To get to Penglai Pavilion, take a minibus from the bus station at the corner of Beima Road and Qingnian Road.

The trip takes one and a half hours. When you get to Penglai, taxi drivers will take you to the pavilion for about SGD2.

HANGZHOU

The prosperous Zhejiang province is your typical modern Chinese economic powerhouse and its newly rich citizens have taken up residence in the capital city of Hangzhou. It's not uncommon to see Ferraris and Lamborghinis cruising the streets alongside the UNESCO World Heritage listed West Lake.

Located in Hangzhou city is Alibaba group(NSY:BABA), one of the New York stock market's biggest IPO's in recent times. Many will also be interested to explore this amazing city for it's long history and beautiful scenic spots.

Smack-dab in the middle of the city, the freshwater lake is surrounded by classical Chinese gardens and rolling hills. It has inspired a legion of poets, painters and scholars. One of the artists, the Song dynasty poet Su Dongpo, conceived a causeway that joins the north and south end of the lake. Hiring a public bicycle (you'll need to register at one of the kiosks for a rental card; rentals cost about 25 cents per hour) is a great and cheap way to explore the lake. When you get tired of peddling, board one of the many boats that do lake cruises (from SGD11).

Find time to visit the interesting Zhejiang Art Museum (http://www.zjam. org.cn/Site_En/news/2013/002/00742. shtml, 138 Nanshan Road) for some compelling Chinese contemporary art. Come night time, catch the Impression West Lake (http://www.hzyxxh.com/en/) –

a live performance on the lake conceived by acclaimed Chinese director Zhang Yimou (of Raise the Red Lantern fame). Tickets start at around SGD15.

The Hangzhou Xiaoshan International Airport (http://www.hzairport.com/), 30km east of the city, has flights throughout most of China as well as international flights from Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Seoul, Tokyo, Osaka, Taipei and Bangkok. A taxi into town will cost SGD29.

HAINAN

The tropical island of Hainan is China's southernmost spot and a popular getaway for locals who come for the sun, soft sand, surf and a round or three of golf. With fantastic amenities, great food and a pleasant vibe, you could easily while away weeks kicking back on Hainan.

The capital Haikou, on the northernmost tip of the island, is a good base and a transport hub from which to explore the rest of the island. From here, you can easily strike out by bus or train to the rest of Hainan.

The Xinglong area, on the south-eastern end of the island, is an idyllic place with beaches, hot springs and relaxing attractions, including Shimei Bay, a popular spot for surfing, with several excellent breaks for all surfing ability levels.

Another popular beach area is Sanya, on the southwest of the island. The 40km stretch of development is popular for its resorts and seafood. The beachfront has plenty of bars and restaurants serving up fresh seafood.

Hainan's capital airport is the Haikou Meilan International Airport (www. mlairport.com) in Haikou. Here, there are





domestic and international connections to Singapore, Bangkok, Taipei and Kuala Lumpur. There's also the Sanya Phoenix International Airport (www.sanyaairport.com) in Sanya with domestic and international connections.

LIJIANG AND LUGU LAKE, YUNNAN

Located in Yunnan in Southwest China, Lijiang, like the rest of the province, is famed for its ethnic minority population. The Naxi people call this area home – home being the UNESCO heritage listed old town. Each year, more than five million tourists descend on this charming maze of rustic wooden buildings set in narrow, cobblestone alleys.

The picturesque town might seem crowded at times, so it's worth starting your day early. Wander the streets and poke around souvenir shops and when you get hungry, make a beeline for the Sakura Good Food Square (Qiyi Street), an openair food market where you can sample

Naxi cuisine such as potato pancakes and stuffed rice balls.

When it gets crowded, pick up a map and hire a bicycle (from SGD7 per day) to explore the neighboring countryside. There are a few monasteries and temples within 10km of the old town: Puji Monastery is the easiest to access. The Shuhe Old Town, four kilometers north of Lijiang, is a mini, lesser visited version of Lijiang's old town and worth spending a day or two looking around.

Also in Yunnan is the remote alpine Lugu Lake (Lugu Hu in Chinese) right on the border with the Sichuan province and 200km north of Lijiang. Located almost three kilometers above sea level, this lake is an enchanting 50-square-kilometer body of water set against a backdrop of lush forest.

Buses will drop you at Luoshui where you can find further transport to villages around the lake's circumference. Lige – nine kilometers from Luoshui – is a one of the more popular towns. The Tibetans, Li and Moso people make their home here

and can take you out on canoe tours of the lake. The unspoilt scenery and fresh air make Lugu Lake a good spot for respite from the pollution that plagues most Chinese cities.

Lijiang is accessed by its eponymous airport (www.lijiang-airport.com), 25km south of the Old Town. It has domestic flights to major cities in China. Airport buses (SGD6) take you to and from the airport and old town. To get to Lugu Lake, take a direct bus from the Lijiang bus station (fares costs approximately SGD20 each and the journey takes seven hours, departing at 9am and 10am daily – although these times are subject to change).

These sights are just the tip of the proverbial 'Exotic China' iceberg: there are literally thousands of towns, temples, villages, mountains and lakes well worth exploring. China is truly a country of diverse sights so start packing your bags and learning how to say Ni Hao (hello) and Xie Xie (thank you).

of Beijing and Shanghai so take a phrasebook or better still, download a language translation/diction app on your smartphone. A good one is Pleco (https://www.pleco.com/), available for iOS and Android. Locals appreciate foreigners making an effort at speaking their language – it helps break the ice.

ATMs in China are plentiful though not all work with foreign cards. Even those that do accept foreign cards might not work. When this happens, just look for another machine. If you plan on making ATM withdrawals in China, make sure your ATM card is enabled for use on the Plus or Cirrus networks.

While Wi-Fi is now fairly ubiquitous in China, getting a mobile SIM card for an internet connection is cheap and easy. Doing this gives you access to useful apps such as maps and emails while you are on the road. China Unicom offers good plans and there are counters (with English-speaking staff) at Beijing and Shanghai airports. Just make sure your device is GSM compatible and not locked to a network. Plans are currently roughly SGD17 for 300mb of data.

Think a lush theme-park zoo is as green as Orlando gets? Not a chance. Eco-adventures abound just beyond the city's borders.





Eco-Safaris

It may take a while to get to **Forever Florida's** parking lot, since a horseback rider or peacock may be blocking the road. But once inside you're in a complex that's at once a working ranch, an ecopark with guided tours and an adventure facility with ziplining.

Created by the Broussard family in memory of their naturalist son, Allen, who died young, Forever Florida aims to preserve Florida's fragile eco-systems and educate the public about conservation.

Guided eco-safaris run through parts of the 4,700-acre property in covered coaches. These vehicles, commonly known in Florida as swamp buggies because of their oversized wheels, easily traverse the terrain. Your journey may reveal baby alligators or 11.5-footers, white-tailed deer or wild hogs, turtles or spiders the size of your palm. Each tour is different, but the banter is always educational. The guides are knowledgeable about the trees, the duckweed over the water and all the creatures that live among them.

And if you're interested in the ziplining but don't want to miss the nature tour? No worries—you can get a mini eco-tour en route to the zipline area. *foreverflorida.com; tour packages from S*₃2

Canoeing on the Wekiva

Head north to Wekiwa Springs State Park for sublime canoeing and kayaking along the Wekiva River (both the park and the river, spelled differently, are pronounced wuh-KIVE-uh). That locals gather here en masse on weekends is testimony to its appeal as a respite from Orlando's bustling scene.

If the term Old Florida is appropriate anywhere, this is the spot. One can picture Timucuans or Creeks lounging by the water beneath the oak trees in what is now a wonderland of 7,800 acres, or traversing the 15-mile water trail by canoe.

After paying the six-dollar state-park entrance fee, drive to the very last parking lot. Past the playground and the shaded picnic tables with barbecue grills is a short trail that leads straight to the river. There you can rent a boat and lose sight of civilization for a couple of hours. 1800 Wekiwa Circle, Apopka; canoewekiva.com; 407-884-4311; rentals from \$18

Into the Wild at the Disney Wilderness Preserve

Disney generously donated land to the Nature Conservancy to create the **Disney Wilderness Preserve** and paid for the site's restoration. Far off a side road south of its namesake theme park, this 11,500-acre site is essentially a wilderness trail through former ranchland that has been returned to its natural state. It has two hiking options, of one and 2.15 miles, respectively. Both trails are wide, flat and well marked.

Birds abound here. You may hear them calling Woo hoo! Woo hoo hoo hoo! from high in the trees while you stroll past pines and saw palmetto. Experienced birders may spot red-cockaded woodpeckers, wood storks and sandhill cranes. On land, animals such as Sherman's fox squirrels and gopher tortoises make their homes amid the swampy confines.

Be sure to spend a few minutes at the picnic tables overlooking Lake Russell, where cypress trees (and their "knees") form an otherworldly landscape. 2700 Scrub Jay Trail, Kissimmee; 407-935-0002; nature.org; free

Visit an Egg Farm

As you close in on the chicken and duck farm known as Lake Meadow Naturals, on busy Highway 429, you may doubt there could be an eco-spot within even 10 miles. Yet mere minutes from the exit you'll enter a serene complex containing a working farm, a country store, gardens and, on Fridays and Saturdays, a spot where visitors can pick their own eggs from chickens' nests.

Children delight in the enclosed area where during hatching season they can pet the chicks. Visitors can stroll around the shaded grounds while the chickens and ducks meander through their pens and barn, clucking (or quacking) happily. All are heritage breeds—including hens that lay eggs with a greenish hue. 10000 Mark Adam Rd., Ocoee; 407-399-7670; lakemeadownaturals.com

It's hard to believe that all of Orlando's green spaces are only a short trip from downtown. Enjoy a day canoeing (leisurely) on the Wekiva River.

Florida by Boat

"This is the real Florida, folks," says the **Premier Boat Tours** captain as he guides a pontoon boat across Lake Dora, part of the Harris Chain of Lakes, on the way to the Dora Canal. After crossing the lake, he steers the vessel along the narrow waterway, which is shaded by cypress trees. One of them is estimated to be 2,250 years old—dead for more than 300 yet still standing.

The Dora Canal is protected by local, state and federal agencies. Consequently, the verdant foliage is the backdrop for fauna of all kinds. You may see a great blue heron, a tricolored heron and an anhinga lounging near a baby turtle shaded by Spanish moss. On this ride you'll even glide past an alligator breeding ground. *Departure points vary*; 352-434-8040;

A Slice of Africa

After visiting Africa 30 times to lead safaris and participate in international zoo conferences, Lex Salisbury created the Giraffe Ranch—a 47-acre swath of land adjoining an 875-acre wilderness area. Hundreds of live oak trees shade the zebras and giraffes, which guests are invited to feed from the coach that takes them around the savannah.

Animals live well here, each breed penned in an expansive area with species friendly to it. Over the course of a 60- to 90-minute exploration, you'll probably encounter ostriches, Sicilian donkeys, blackbuck antelopes, llamas, axis deer, warthogs and pygmy hippos. For an extra fee you can feed two Indian rhinos, which gobble up whole apples and wedges of cabbage and pumpkin. 38650 Mickler Rd., Dade City; 813-482-3400; girafferanch.com; adults \$70

Finding Your Path

If time is limited or you'd be satisfied with a sliver of eco, plan an outing to the West Orange Trail, a growing 22-mile stretch adjacent to the neighboring county's ninemile South Lake Trail. Hop on at any point, such as the Oakland Nature Preserve or the Killarney Station, a remote outpost that has a bike and skate rental shop (bonus: bikes built for two). Then walk, jog, ride, glide or skateboard your way past pretty town centers, playgrounds, residential neighborhoods and undeveloped areas.


You'll find locals along the path whenever the weather is nice, walking their dogs or heading to Winter Garden's quaint historic district. About 55,000 people a month find their way to this scenic stretch of Florida along the West Orange Trail. Winter Garden; orangecountyfl.net; free

Get on Your High Horse

Located within a 14,000-acre reserve, Rock Springs Run Trail Rides is an operator that takes guests 6 and older through hammocks, pine forests and open meadows to spot wild turkeys, deer and bald eagles.

The facility's 21 horses are all on their second careers. Owner Debra Jamie Zito buys them once they're done with their more demanding jobs and trains them to take riders of all levels around the property. One is an American Thoroughbred that worked as a polo horse in Argentina. Another is a great-grandson of Secretariat, the legendary Triple Crown winner.

VICTORIA

There is no better to place to experience Australia's love affair with food, wine and boutique beer than regional Victoria.

With more than 850 wineries spread across the state, the only trouble you'll have is choosing where to go and who to take with you.

From the original vineyards of the Yarra Valley to the spectacular coast of the Mornington Peninsula, it offers a unique blend of cool-climate wines and influences of European heritage. But with great wine comes beautiful fresh produce that is a mix of local and international cuisine. From spicy Asian and classic European to progressive Latin American, this state is bursting with flavour.

Tie this in with the increasingly popular craft breweries and you'll wonder why it's taken you this long to hop around the incredibly beautiful Victoria.









WINE COUNTRY

The best part about visiting Victoria's wine regions are their proximity to Melbourne. Just one hour's drive south of the capital city is the picturesque Mornington Peninsula. A favorite weekend getaway for Melburnians, it is a mix of lush green hinterland and

spectacular coastline and is home to more than 50 boutique cellar doors.

Renowned for its pinot noir, the area has also experimented with some newer varietals, including pinot grigio, pinot gris and shiraz. The region is made up of microclimates that influence the character of the soil and therefore the

flavours of the wine. From Red Hill to Main Ridge and Dromana, this is wine country you cannot miss.

Stop at the well-known and incredibly popular T'Gallant Winery to taste their signature pinot gris. Oozing Italian influences, its restaurant has become an institution in the area.

For something a little grander, the Montalto Vineyard and Olive Grove will impress with its Chef's Hat-rated restaurant and cellar door. Famous for its chardonnay and pinot noir, it also has an olive grove that produces excellent coldpressed extra virgin olive oils.

Other notable wineries in the area include Port Phillip Estate, Ten Minutes By Tractor and Red Hill Estate.

WHERE TO STAY

The Nepcan Country Club and Day Spa (Property ID: 1169) sits in the heart of the Mornington Peninsula on 35 acres of landscaped gardens. If you're after a day off from visiting cellar doors you can visit the club and enjoy a game of tennis or go canoeing or swimming.

YARRA VALLEY

As the birthplace of Victoria's wine industry, the Yarra Valley is a blend of old and new, influenced by a strong history and tradition.

Winemaking in the region dates back to 1838 and generations of vignerons have worked hard to produce world class wines that showcase the region's cool-climate grapes.

Less than an hour's drive east of Melbourne, the Yarra Valley offers breathtaking vistas with every turn. Stop at the popular TarraWarra Estate and sample its pinot noir and chardonnay. The estate sits on 400 hectares of prime Yarra Valley farmland.

One of the biggest wineries in the area is Yering Station. Established in 1838 as Victoria's first vineyard, it features perfectly manicured gardens and a regional farmer's market every third Sunday of the month.

MANSFIELD AND MOUNT BUILLER

About two-and-a-half hour's drive from Melbourne are the High Country towns of Mansfield and Mt Buller. The region's rugged countryside and alpine landscape is best known as an adventure sports playground, but it is also home to craft breweries, artisan food producers and

wineries, including Delatite Wines and Ros Ritchie Wines.

WHERE TO STAY

The Mansfield Country Resort (Property ID: 0827) is a great option for families, with units that accommodate up to four people. On the shore of Lake Eildon guests can play tennis, squash or mini golf.

MACEDON RANGES

Less than an hour's drive from Melbourne is the Macedon Ranges where you will find some of Australia's best boutique wineries. Here you will discover hidden vineyards and have the chance to sample limited edition wines. This area is about small-scale, family-owned wineries that produce elegant chardonnays, pinot noirs and shirazes. Pull in at the Granite Hills Winery, home to Australia's benchmark riesling and enjoy a classic peppery shiraz.

WHERE TO STAY

Kyncton Bushland Resort (Property ID: 0830) provides self-contained villas and apartments nestled among the Australian bushland. Play a round of golf or spot some of the native wildlife, including kangaroos and echidnas.

GEELONG

In the 1800s, Geelong was once the largest grape growing region in Victoria and is now being rediscovered as wine growers once again take to its rich soils and ideal climate.

Producers showcase wines with a European influence – bold flavors that match its climate, which is halfway between temperatures in France's Bordeaux and Burgundy regions. Expect to try beautiful chardonnays and shirazes from its cellar doors.

Scotchmans Hill situated in the heart of the Bellarine Peninsula offers all its wines for tasting, including its exclusive single vineyard and Cornelius wines. Sit in their sunlit courtyard and enjoy the magnificent views over Port Phillip Bay.

FOOD. GLORIOUS FOOD


Hand in hand with excellent wine comes fabulous regional food. From the Great Ocean Road to the High Country, Victoria's local produce is diverse and incredibly fresh.


THE GREAT OCEAN ROAD

Stretching hundreds of miles through fertile farm country, the Great Ocean Road is a foodie's paradise. Fresh seafood is caught from the bordering Bass Strait and Southern Ocean and local produce is offered at farm gates and providores.

Stop at Cheese World and try the region's gourmet cheeses, including Apostle Whey, Timboon and Meredith cheeses.

Pick your own blueberries, strawberries and raspberries from Tuckerberry Hill and Gentle Annie Berry Gardens and don't

















miss the farmers markets with their local delicacies and homemade bread.

HIGH COUNTRY

Located in the northeast of Victoria, the High Country sits among some of the state's highest mountains, lakes and ski resorts. The local towns of Rutherglen and Milawa are known for their mouth watering produce unique to the area.

Milawa is the breadbasket of the region with fresh cheeses, meats, fish and olives. If fine dining is more your thing Michael Ryan from Provenance at Beechworth and Emma Handley at Villa Gusto will leave you with unforgettable dining experiences.

MACEDON RANGES

Food in the Macedon region is diverse, blending local produce with international flavors. In Daylesford, indulge in regional delicacies with a Japanese twist at the hatted Kazuki's at the Raglan. Savour the produce at Cliffy's Emporium or walk along Kyneton's Piper Street and be lured by menus featuring the best of the region's produce.

THE MURRAY

Known as Victoria's food bowl, the rich soils, sunny climate and irrigated water means there is a seemingly endless supply of fruit and vegetables, gournet cheeses and freshwater fish in this area.

The Echuca Moama Food and Wine Trail has more than 40 wineries, restaurants and pubs to satisfy your appetite. Throw a line into the river and snag a freshwater fish for dinner, including the famous Murray cod.

Roadside stalls and farmers markets sell olives, nuts, jams, fresh fruit and vegetables. The Hume Murray Farmers Market in Wodonga is a favorite as is the fortnightly Sunraysia Farmers Market in Mildura.

Jim McDougall in Stefano's Cellar in Mildura has been a destination for foodies for more than 20 years and is committed to local produce with a rustic touch.

Further south in the Murray is Swan Hill, home to Australia's stone fruit industry. Its farms offer nectarines, peaches, pistachios and almonds.

WHERE TO STAY

The Murray Valley Resort (Property ID: 0953) is the perfect spot for exploring the region's boutique producers and restaurants. With pools, tennis courts and mini-golf, this is where you can wind down after a day of feasting.

THE GOLDFIELDS

A blend of quaint townships and rolling countryside, the Goldfields area boasts fresh regional produce, excellent dining and some of the best wine in the state.

Savor the bull-boar sausages, locally pressed olive oil and creamy goat cheese. The Taste of Gold Trail is perfect for exploring the area's fresh produce and wineries.

THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA

Not just a coastline of wineries, the Mornington Peninsula offers hidden eateries, local markets, olive groves and roadside stalls. Melburnians love the local providores, including Merricks and Somers.

The famous Red Hill and Montalto farmers market are the place to stock up on free-range eggs and organic vegetables.









COAST TO COUNTRY: (from above) Hire a paddle boat on Lake Daylesford; take in the sea breeze and some fresh seafood at Apollo Bay; try homemade delights from a farmers market or gourmet fair in Kyneton.

YARRA VALLEY

Generations of immigrants brought a distinct flavour to the region's food, which includes pasta, cheese, chilli, capsicum, smoked fish and salmon.

The monthly Yarra Valley farmers markets are bursting with fresh produce. Why not pick your own berries from the berry farms and finish the day with a sweet indulgence from the Yarra Valley Chocolaterie.

CRAFT BREWERIES

Regional Victoria is now home to more than 30 independently owned craft breweries that produce up to 15,000 litres of beer each week. With a focus on ales that range from red and brown to cloudy wheat styles, porters and stouts, they have quickly become mandatory stops on the food and wine trail.

The Mornington Peninsula Brewery is recognised as one of Australia's leading craft breweries with six award-winning beers on tap as well as daily specialties.

The Yarra Valley has a rich history of beer due to the farming of hops in the early 1800s and it remains part of its gastronomic identity. Here you will find the popular Coldstream Brewery, which opened its doors in 2007. Watch the microbrewery in action from its adjoining

restaurant and see the Coldstream beers being brewed in small, carefully made batches.

The Yarra Valley is also known for its ciders, including Kellybrook's cider, which has been in the area for 50 years.

STRIKING A BALANCE BETWEEN SUN PROTECTION AND VITAMIN D













GET SOME D: (left to right) If you live somewhere that does not see too much sun you can supplement your daily intake with cod liver oil capsules, eggs, salmon, milk and cereals.

he link between sun exposure and skin cancer is undeniable. Yet research has shown that Vitamin D—the "sunshine vitamin" the body makes when sun hits skin—may protect against some cancers. Oncologist Howard Kaufman of Rush University Medical Centre and Walter Willett, Chair of the nutrition department at Harvard School of Public Health, advised us on safely getting our Vitamin D.

Know Your Risks

There are two classes of skin cancer - melanoma (the more deadly) and non-melanoma (more common but with a 95 percent cure rate). Though not all melanomas are caused by sun exposure, sun seems to play a role in some. "Prevention has to be individualized," Kaufman, a melanoma specialist, says. He tells his patients to limit their exposure if there is a family history of non-melanoma skin cancers, such as basal and squamous cell cancer, or melanoma skin cancer.

Eat Your Vitamins

It's easy to incorporate Vitamin D into your diet. Oily fish like salmon, mackerel, herring and sardines are high in the vitamin, as are eggs and fortified cereals and milk. There are limits to relying on diet for Vitamin D, however. Unless you eat fish every day, you won't come close to the 600 IU (international units) a day that the Institute of Medicine recommends.

Vitamin D Supplements

"The amount of Vitamin D we get from 20 minutes in the sun depends on our skin color, time of year, location and how much skin is exposed," Willett says. For this reason and especially if you live at a northern latitude and work indoors, taking

a supplement is a more reliable way of getting Vitamin D.* (Not to mention safer if you have a family history of melanoma.) Two years ago the Institute of Medicine re-evaluated its recommended daily intake level for Vitamin D and tripled it from 200 IU a day to 600 IU. (It rose to 800 IU a day for those over 70.) Some doctors, including Willett, think most people would benefit from 1,000 to 2,000 IU a day. (No toxicity has been documented at levels of less than 10,000 IU a day.) The jury is still out on which form is better, but Willett prefers the natural form of the vitamin, known as D3 (or cholecalciferol). Also, taking Vitamin D with meals is usually recommended, since the fat soluble vitamin is absorbed better when consumed with food.

Protect Yourself

It can be hard to avoid the sun on vacations, especially when you're hiking, swimming or snorkelling. Kaufman recommends covering up with a hat and a long sleeved shirt. "In general I think clothing works better than sunblock," he says. Sunblock can be an effective source of protection. Consider trying a broad spectrum sunblock, like Neutrogena's Ultra Sheer Dry-Touch, which contains Helioplex, a substance said to block both

UVA and UVB rays. Remember to reapply every two hours, no matter how high the SPF. Use a broad spectrum lip balm, too and be sure to protect your eyes with 100 percent UVA and UVB absorbing sunglasses.

Soak It Up

If you don't have a family history of melanoma and prefer getting your sunshine vitamin from the sun, consider holding off on the sunblock for a short time in the morning. "Sunblock stops the ultraviolet sun rays that activate Vitamin D in our skin," Willett says. Just know that frequent sun exposure causes changes in the skin's basal and squamous cells as well as wrinkling, so there's reason to keep the sunblock within reach.





WELCOME TO THE BEAUTIFUL TIOMAN ISLAND (PULAU TIOMAN IN THE MALAY LANGUAGE). ACCORDING TO A LOCAL FOLKLORE, TIOMAN IS THE RESTING PLACE OF A FABLED DRAGON PRINCESS. WHILST FLYING TO VISIT HER PRINCE IN SINGAPORE, THIS BEAUTIFUL MAIDEN STOPPED TO SEEK SOLACE IN THE CRYSTAL CLEAR WATERS OF THE SOUTH CHINA SEA. ENRAPTURED BY THE ISLAND'S CHARMS. SHE DECIDED TO STAY. TAKING THE FORM OF AN ISLAND, SHE PLEDGED TO OFFER SHELTER AND COMFORT TO ALL PASSING TRAVELERS.

Today the first thing visitors will notice about Tioman Island is how blessed it is with miles of soft white sand, swaying palms, cool waterfalls and wild flowers growing in vivid profusion. It's the perfect paradise if you enjoy a quite retreat, sea sports, trekking or just lazing in the sun.



<< TIOMAN ISLAND, MALAYSIA

Located 20 miles off the east coast of Malaysia in the state of Pahang it's fairly tiny in size measuring just 24 miles in length and 8 miles wide. With eight main villages, including the popular Kampung Tekek in the north, the island is covered by dense forest and surrounded by numerous coral reefs, making it a popular haven for diving and snorkeling enthusiasts. There are numerous dive schools on the island and usually you pay around RM90 (SGD\$36) for each dive (this includes use of equipment).

You can learn more about the island by paying a visit to the marine park centre at Kampung Tekek. Stroll along the island's many beaches and take a swim in the secluded bays, including the famous beach immortalized as Bali Hai in the 1958 movie, South Pacific.

The good news also is that Tioman is a duty free island, which means some items (especially alcohol) are much cheaper as compared to the mainland (a beer or cocktail will only set you back a few ringgits). Around the villages of Tekek and Salang you will be able to find numerous bars which have an active nightlife.

There are almost no roads on Tioman, just a few quite jungle tracks. These are perfect for light

trekking. There are popular treks from Tekek to Juara or you can test yourself by hiking from Tekek all the way to Monkey Bay. If you want to hop from one village to the other the best way is to use the Mersing/Tioman Bluewater Express ferry service. They charge around RM15 (SGD\$6) per trip making it an easy and reliable way to explore the island by boat.

Tioman has many beautiful cascading waterfalls and one of the most popular is the Mukut Waterfall where many local families hang out on the weekends. Tioman's biggest waterfall is the Asah Waterfall and its natural beauty provides a welcomed change from the beach and is well suited for a picnic lunch.

Tioman is accessible by boat from Mersing in Johor. The Bluewater Express ferry service tickets cost RM85/ Adult (SGD\$35.50) and RM75/Child (SGD\$30) for return transfer. There's



also a plane service by Berjaya Air from Changi Aiport in Singapore and the Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport in Subang, Selangor.



KNOWN FOR ITS TROPICAL BEACHES AND WILDLIFE SANCTUARIES, PALAWAN ISLAND IN THE PHILIPPINES IS ALSO HOME TO THE PUERTO PRINCESA SUBTERRANEAN RIVER NATIONAL PARK WHICH WAS RECENTLY LISTED AS ONE OF NEW 7 WONDERS OF NATURE.

With seascapes the equal of any in Southeast Asia and amazing aquatic and terrestrial wildlife, nothing defines Palawan Island more than one of its favorite tourist destinations. Palawan is a long narrow island with hundreds of smaller islands that surround it. These islands stretch across the South China Sea and the Sulu Sea from Mondoro to Borneo.



THREE VIEWS OF PARADISE: From every angle Palawan is an area of immense natural beauty that will take the breath away of even the most jaded traveler.

Centrally located Puerto Princesa City is Palawan's capital and primary gateway to the nearby beaches and major tourist attractions. The city also has a host of shopping and dining options and is known as one of the cleanest and greenest cities in the world.

A stay in Puerto Princesa City wouldn't be complete without a visit to the World Heritage Puerto Princesa Subterranean River National Park. This breathtaking wonder features a 5.5 mile navigable underground river, reputed to be the world's longest. The river winds its way through a spectacular cave before emptying out in to the South China Sea.

The river flows through a deep cavern where you'll get to take in rugged limestone and marble cliffs while enjoying the beautiful crystalline waters of the underground lagoon. As you wind through the tunnel aboard a paddle boat you will be enthralled at every turn with stalactite pillars, rock formations, and domed amphitheatres.


The Puerto Princesa Subterranean River National Park is located in Bahile and is about 50 miles from the city. You can reach the river by going through Barangay Cabayugan to Sabang, from where you catch a pump boat ride to the river, or hike through a monkey trail. An alternative way is to hire a pump boat ride from Bahile wharf. Travel time through Barangay Cabayugan is about one and a half hours.

While in Puerto Princesa also check out Honda Bay. The bay consists of several islands with shallow reefs bordering fabulous beaches which have become the favorite swimming, snorkeling, and diving destinations for international tourists.

These islands including the Cannon Island, Bat Island, Lu-Ii Island, Meara Marina and Starfish Island are known

for their fine white sand and clear water teeming with varieties of starfish. Pump boats can be hired to take tourists to Honda Bay, which is located in Lourdes, about 8 miles east of Puerto Princesa.

Palawan Island is accessible by air and boat from Manila, Iloilo and Cebu. It is approximately 55 minutes by air from Manila and 1 hour 15 minutes from Cebu. Public transport within Palawan consist of buses, vans and tricycles and there is a big well organized transport terminal at Puerto Princesa, where travelers can access flights to other parts of Palawan.

The Rock stands about 75 feet high and you can climb through caves and crevices. It's advisable to wear proper hiking gear. Cost is P200 (SGD\$5.75)/person.
